The *Morphological Aspects of Pontic Greek Spoken in Georgia* by Dr. Svetlana Berikashvili is an excellent treaty of the nominal and verbal morphology of Pontic spoken in Georgia and a valuable addition to the Pontic Greek literature. The author provides a detailed presentation of the major declensional classes of nouns underlying at the same time the similarities and differences with other Pontic varieties. The verbal system is discussed at length with particular emphasis on the tense and aspect distinctions in the various conjugations and a short discussion of the peripherality of infinitival forms. There is an abundace of new, priceless data that shed light on issues of language contact of Pontic not only with Turkish but also with Russian and of course Georgian. I strongly believe that Dr. Berikashvili's monograph will be an interesting reading for linguists and everyone interested in the grammar and the history of Greek dialects in general and of Pontic in particular.
